Ron Levy, internationally acclaimed pianist, has been called "first-class" by the New York Times. He regularly appears in major venues, both as a soloist and collaborative artist, and has been pianist and harpsichordist of many symphony orchestras. Ron has been Associate Artist of the venerable All Seasons Chamber Players; he was a frequent guest soloist with the resident chamber ensemble of the NY Metropolitan Museum of Art. A resident of Vermont for over 20 years, Ron was a faculty and Board member of the Manchester Music Festival, Music Director and Conductor of the Opera Theatre in Weston, Program and Music Director at the historic Equinox Hotel, and impresario of the "Music On The Hill" chamber music series of the Southern Vermont Art Center. A graduate of Oberlin Conservatory, he has taught at numerous colleges, and is currently on the faculty of Montclair University's Cali School of Music, as well as The Ridgewood Conservatory. In addition, he is Music Director of the Unitarian Society of Ridgewood, pianist & Assistant Conductor of the Orpheus Club Men's' Chorus, a founding member of the Arundo Trio, and pianist of the award-winning Palisades Virtuosi [2022 American Prize], of which he is also a founding member. A prolific recording artist, CDs by Mr. Levy are available on the Albany, Centaur, Eroica, 4-Tay, Great Kate, High Point, Koch International, Phoenix, South Mountain and Summit labels.

A two-term President of the Professional Music Teachers' Guild of NJ, Mr. Levy is a member of the Board of Trustees of the Rockland [NY] and Monmouth [NJ] symphony orchestras; he is also a consultant to BIM Music Publications, Switzerland.

Jeffrey Bittner is proudly serving in his twenty-second year as Director of Bands at Mahwah High School where he directs the MHS Symphonic Band, Marching Thunderbirds, Jazz Ensemble, Chamber Ensembles, Pit Orchestra, and Music Theory/Appreciation classes. Mr. Bittner received his bachelor's degree in Performance/Music Education from William Paterson University and a master's degree in Clarinet Performance from Ithaca College. He studied clarinet with Michael Galván at Ithaca College and with Karl Herman and William Shadel at William Paterson University.

Mr. Bittner's professional and community experiences include performances with the New Jersey Symphony Orchestra, New Jersey Wind Symphony, Eastern Wind Symphony, New York Opera Exchange, Litha Symphony Wind Ensemble, North Jersey Philharmonic, and of course, the Teaneck Community Band. He has played in the Teaneck Community band for twenty-two years. Bittner was also a member of the Cadets Drum and Bugle Corps in 1996 where he played trumpet in the Closing Ceremonies of the Olympic Games in Atlanta, Georgia.

The Mahwah High School bands have prospered under Mr. Bittner's direction. The band has received consistent superior ratings at regional, state, and national festivals including eleven gold ratings at the Region I Concert Band Festival and has been invited to perform as an honors band at the New Jersey State Gala Concert seven times. The band also performed at the NJMEA State Conference in East Brunswick, Avery Fisher Hall- Lincoln Center, and at the World War II Memorial in Washington D.C. Outside of music, Mr. Bittner takes part in "Competitive Bearding" where he travels to compete in local, state, national, and world beard and mustache competitions. Money raised at these competitions has supported
