Green Acres Guidelines

For updating Municipal Open Space and Recreation Plans >>>

The current Open Space Plan is from 2007 and is out of date. The 2024 update will keep the municipality current until 2029 for matching funds through the Green Acres program.



The amended Open Space Plan includes the recently completed Recreation and Open Space Inventory (signed May 2024).

Benefits of Open Space



Contributes to quality of life

>>>> Improves air and water quality and flood mitigation



Enhances homeowner property value

Encourages physical activity

Provides storage of carbon in trees to combat climate change

Maintains wildlife habitat for both flora and fauna



Goals of the 2019 OSRP Update

- Enhance parks and open space while protecting environmentally sensitive features.
- Maintain and upgrade the existing system of parks to provide for residents of all ages and abilities.
- Preserve unique and historically significant structures and areas.
- Preserve the residential character.
- Provide a continuous walkable trail throughout the Hackensack River Greenway.
- Establish pocket parks, especially in neighborhoods where there are no parks.
- Join the national "10-minute walk" program.





Municipal Open Space Trust Fund

History of the Open Space Program

- 2004 MOST approved by voters
- 2005 MOST set at 1 cent, Advisory Board formed
- 2007 Open Space and Recreation Plan adopted
- 2006 Acquired 662 Pomander Walk
- 2010 Acquired 640 River Road
- 2014 Acquired 671 Pomander Walk

MOST

- \$6.85 million generated through MOST since 2005
- \$506,700 collected in 2018 (MOST)
- \$1.61 million current balance (December 2018)
- \$6.14 million spent on recreation development projects
- \$1.05 million spent on open space acquisition
- \$880,034 received from NJDEP Green Acres Program
- \$1,586,813 received from Bergen County



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
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Map 1: Open Space Teaneck Township, Bergen County

Recommendations & Action Plan

Within One Year

- Adopt the Open Space and Recreation Plan Update as part of the Master Plan.
- Submit the Open Space and Recreation Plan Update to the Green Acres program at the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection.
- Develop a plan for engaging local and community recommendations on the future of the Route 4 Greenbelt.
- Reach out to residents to provide continued dialogue on future improvements to municipal parks and recreational areas, expand outreach initiatives to include various social media platforms to capture a diverse demographic of community members.
- Examine Township-owned properties for placement on the Recreation and Open Space Inventory (ROSI), to ensure their permanent protection as open space. This includes the properties along the Route 4 Greenbelt. Resolve an inconsistencies in the ROSI with NJDEP and the Township professional staff.

Within Three Years

- Implement the recommendations of the Hackensack River Greenway to identify and reach out to property owners, including Fairleigh Dickinson University, to promote and connect the Greenway in the Township.
- Investigate the feasibility of completing an inventory of the municipal street trees to improve public awareness and continued maintenance by the Department of Public Works.
- Work with historic organizations to expand local opportunities for historic conservation and education.
- Consider municipal recognition of the Route 4 Greenbelt as a historic site in the Township.



Ongoing

- On an annual basis, review and provide an accounting of the use of the MOST for residents and governing body.
- Work with the
 governing body and
 administration to
 ensure full
 membership on MOST
 Committee, including
 the addition of a
 public member.
