Teaneck Environmental Commission

Annual Report covering 2016 and 2017 Completed July 26, 2017

INTRODUCTION

This report was prepared in accord with Township Ordinance Section 2-125 and NJSA 40:56 A-4 which require the Environmental Commission (EC) to are not less than annual reports to the Township Council in writing. This report includes data collected in 2016 and 2017 on site plan reviews, conducted by the EC as provided by the Municipal Land Use Law (MLUL) for ECs which have an Environmental Resource Inventory (ERI), as does Teaneck. Data are shown on tables appended to this report and discussed below. Additional information in this report includes training, grants, projects worked on during the years 2016-7 to date, budget, goals for the future, recognitions and acknowledgements.

The EC provides advice to the Council on environmental issues and concerns via the Manager and via our Council representative to the EC (currently Mayor M. Hameeduddin). It may initiate Township-wide meetings and forums to gain public input and to inform residents on a variety of environmental issues.

COMMISSIONER TRAINING

EC Secretary, Bettina Hempel-Gilbert attended the ANJEC training seminar for commissioners, "Fundamentals for Effective Environmental Commissioners", March 25, 2017, Cranford, NJ

EC Chair, Aryeh Meir attended the Bergen County Environmental Council annual conference in September, 2016 on the Sustainable Jersey program.

GRANTS

The EC will supervise a \$1500 ANJEC grant for the rehabilitation of the Teaneck Greenway. EC is working with Marie Warnke of the Hackensack River Greenway Advisory Board for trail improvements along Riverside Trail.

STATUS OF 2016 GOALS

1. Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan

The EC has been working with the Council on a Complete Streets Ordinance. Things have begun to move with the proposal to the Council to study what it would mean for Teaneck to adopt a Complete Streets program. The EC will continue to urge the Council to seriously study the Complete Streets idea and adopt an appropriate Ordinance.

2. Sustainability

a. Plastic Bag Ordinance

The EC worked with the local Girl Scouts troop 19 and Mayor M. Hammeddudin to the Teaneck Council to move the issue front and center on the Town's environmental agenda. The Council passed the first vote on a 5 cent fee on carry-out bags and will consider a final vote on July 6, 2017. The ordinance passed. This makes Teaneck the largest township in New Jersey to have passed an Ordinance limiting the use of plastic carry-out bags. It will go into effect in one year, and will allow time to work with retailers and with residents on implementation.

b. Trash Collection

EC Commissioners P. Rhodes and B. Hempel-Gilbert prepared a plan to revamp the Township trash collection structure. It includes a zone structure, limiting the number of haulers in each zone of town and a PAYT proposal. This would reduce the number of trucks that currently have access to all streets. Plan was submitted to the Council at Nov. 14, 2016 meeting. We await action by the Council.

3. Assist Hackensack River Greenway Advisory Board

As stated above, the EC will be supervising a \$1500 ANJEC grant for the rehabilitation and expansion of the Greenway. Our point person is EC commissioner Peter Goldman, also a member of said Advisory Board.

4. Storm Water Management

We continue to advocate and educate to reduce storm water runoff. We also work with the Zoning Board and Planning Board, continuing through EC site plan reviews.

5. Trees and Parkland

Private Tree Ordinance/Overhaul of the Shade Tree Protection Ordinance (in coordination with the Shade Tree Advisory Board).(DD)

We have taken the Tenafly ordinance on private trees as an example of what should be done in Teaneck to insure that trees on private property are protected. In October we instructed the Town Manager to instruct the Township attorney to review the Tenafly ordinance (chapter XXVI Trees – Tenafly 26-1) for applicability to Teaneck. The goal of said ordinance is to regulate tree removal by homeowners and to urge the planting of trees on private and public property. As a follow-up, this was presented to our Council liaison for further action.

We have urged the Council to put shade tree planting into the next budget.

6. Outreach and Community Education

The EC participated in several outreach/education events this year. We were co-sponsors of the Plastic Bag Summit in the fall, led by the Girl Scouts of Troop 19. The EC also participated in the EarthFest in Overpeck Park in June. Sponsored by the Hackensack Riverkeeper, the EC distributed materials on a wide range of environmental issues.

7. Proposed Development along the Rt. 4 Corridor

In April 2017, the Planning Board adopted changes to the township Master Plan that could potentially do great harm to the Greenbelt that was established as a protected Open space in a 1930s Master Plan. The EC, in a unanimous resolution of June 21, 2017, voted to oppose Township Ordinance 4026, establishing a "Self-Storage Office District". "...this densely wooded parcel is vital for the preservation of the Teaneck environment as a green barrier along the busy Rt. 4 corridor....(the proposed project) will harm the character and historic efforts of previous Councils...to preserve the historic Greenbelt that makes Teaneck unique among towns bordering Rt. 4.)

8. Leaf-blower Moderation Ordinance

The EC is working on a draft ordinance to place seasonal limitations on the use of two stroke gas-powered leaf blowers. Several towns have enacted such regulations that limit use of leaf blowers to spring and fall (before May 15 and after September 15).

GOALS FOR SECOND HALF OF 2017 AND 2018

1. Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan

- Pass a Complete Streets Ordinance (draft submitted 10/14).
- Work towards the creation of a steering committee on Complete Streets and the Master Plan.

2. Sustainability

- Advocate for sustainability through proposed legislation and restart the Advisory Board on Sustainability.
- Strengthen the plastic bag ordinance by a (BYOB) Bring Your Own Bag campaign. Encourage retailers to provide reusable bags.
- Urge the Council to study and approve a "Waste Collection Small Business
 Opportunity Plan" proposed by the EC. Said plan proposes eight collection
 zones with trash collectors to bid on contracts for each zone. Each street is
 served by one collector, and residents pay by number of bags or bins per
 collection.
- Partner with the business community to increase recycling and reduce plastic bag and Styrofoam use.
- Urge the Township to begin a recycling program for cans and bottles in all parks (especially Votee) and sports fields.
- Work with public and private schools towards Sustainable Jersey goals.
- Explore the potential for instituting green building codes. Advocate for Green Infrastructure. (Sustainable Jersey)
- Explore the possibility for a NRI Natural Resources Inventory.
- Advocate MOST funds be used for open space enhancement.
- Encourage developers and builders to build smarter using porous paving, rainwater harvesting and rain gardens.
- No-idling campaign. Urge the Council to endorse a No-Idling campaign by posting signs in strategic locations, particularly around schools.
- Recycling of Styrofoam. B. Hempel-Gilbert and K. Hoffman are heading up an effort to organize a Styrofoam collection bin at the recycling center, as well as a textile recycling bin.

3. Outreach and Community Education

- Expand outreach activities to Teaneck residents on Teaneck.gov website and on social media.
- Work with other community and civic groups to increase awareness on all environmental issues.

• Participate in public activities such as Hackensack Riverkeepers' EarthFest which the EC participated in the spring.
